

Visitation Policy

For the continued health and safety of our patients, visitors and staff, and in accordance with guidance from state and local health officials, effective **Friday, March 20, 2020**, Redlands Community Hospital will implement a revised visitation policy in order to protect the health and safety of our immunocompromised patients.

No visitors will be allowed into Redlands Community Hospital.

Here is a list of the following exceptions:

Patients Who May Be Facing End of Life – We will work with families to ensure that they are able to be with their family member.

Maternity Patients – For new mothers laboring and delivering, they will be allowed One (1) significant other to be with them throughout their stay.

Neonatal Intensive Care Patients – Parents with an infant in the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit will be allowed to be with their infant, One (1) parent at a time.

Patients Being Discharged – One (1) person to assist in the discharge process.

Patients Who Require Assistance – One (1) parent or guardian can accompany adult individuals with special needs.

Patients Having Procedures – Patients that may need a procedure (e.g., Wound Care, Cardiac Catheterization) will be allowed One (1) support person.

All 1st floor waiting room areas will remain open. However, all inpatient waiting rooms will be closed to the public until further notice. Visitors who fall within the above exemption criteria, may remain on campus from 9 a.m. to 9 p.m. We encourage you to remain in contact with your loved ones through phone calls, texting, video chats, etc. We apologize for any inconvenience this may cause and we thank you for helping maintain a healthy environment for our patients.
